Cruise schedule: Depart 7/7/2018 from Athens (Piraeus), Greece — Santorini, Greece — At Sea — Kotor, Montenegro — Messina, Italy — Naples, Italy — At Sea — Return 7/14/2018 to Barcelona, Spain

Thursday, July 5 - Day 1 - Today we depart for our overnight flight to Athens. (Air schedule/fare -to be arranged)

Friday, July 6 - Day 2 - ATHENS/CORINTH - Upon arrival in Athens, we meet our Tour Guide. We visit the “ruins of the ancient city culminating at the Panathenic Stadium where the first modern day Olympics was held. Then travel to Corinth and then cruise through the canal to experience its awe from the bottom up ending at the Ancient Corinth. Paul lived here for 2 years as a tentmaker while establishing his church. Visit the ruins of the ancient city, explore the historic sites of Mycenae, Epidaurus and marvel at the engineering feat of the Corinth Canal . Afterward, we transfer to our hotel in Athens. Tonight, dinner is on our own at a restaurant in Plaka.

Saturday, July 7 - Day 3 - ATHENS/PIRAEUS PORT (CORAL PRINCESS CRUISE SHIP) - After breakfast, we enjoy a city sightseeing tour of Athens otherwise called the “Divine City”. Visit the Acropolis and its Parthenon, Visit the Areios Pagos (also known as Mars Hill), which used to function as the high Court of Appeal, from where Paul gave his famous sermon about “The Unknown God”. Drive by key points in the city. See Adrian’s Arch. Continue to the port and check-in at our cruise ship, Crown Princess at 2:30pm. This evening, our cruise ship sails at 7pm.

Saturday, July 14 - Day 11 — BARCELONA/MONTSERRAT - Early this morning, we disembark our cruise ship and journey to Montserrat, a monastery near Barcelona and one of Spain’s key religious sites. We visit the Royal Basilica of Montserrat where we view the famous 12th century Romanesque carving of La Moreneta (the Black Madonna). This Marian Shrine has attracted pilgrims for hundreds of years, including St. Ignatius of Loyola, the founder of the Jesuits. We spend some free time exploring the Shrine, then return to Barcelona. We drive along the main avenues with impressive modernist buildings by Gaudí such as La Pedrera and Casa Milá, declared World Heritage buildings, the Montjuic Park with spectacular views of the city and harbor, Olympic Ring, monument to Columbus and the emblematic Gothic Quarter, heart of the old city and its historical center. We visit Sagrada Familia, the unfinished masterpiece of Gaudí (subject to availability). Afterward, we transfer to our hotel. Tonight, dinner is on our own.

Sunday, July 15, Day 12 — BARCELONA/USA - After breakfast, we transfer to the airport for our flight home.

No extra charge	<p>July 8 – Day 4 - SHORE EXCURSION PORT: Santorini</p> <p>Fira, the capital of Santorini - Santorini is an anchorage port: passengers transfer to shore via shore tender. Fira, with myriad of white-washed stone houses jumbled together is quite an impressive sight to take in as you approach it by boat. From the old port, there's a cable car or you can ride a donkey to go up the 586 steps to the village and see the most amazing views you can imagine. Along the spectacular brim of the caldera you will find numerous cafes, bars and restaurants, nicely integrated into the old narrow streets. For a quieter stroll visit the neighborhood of Frangika, <i>or</i> Catholika as it is also known, one of Fira's most beautiful. There are no shops here, only beautiful mansions, churches and monasteries. Frangika is also where you find the large Catholic cathedral, or Domo as the locals named it.</p>
No extra charge	<p>Tuesday, July 10 - Day 6: SHORE EXCURSION PORT: Kotor, Montenegro</p> <p>Kotor is an anchorage port. Passengers transfer to shore via ship's tender. Located along one of the world's most beautiful bays is Kotor. Butted up against a steep cliff, cradled by a calm sea, naturally sheltered by its deep-in-the-fjord position, and watched over by an imposing network of fortifications, Kotor is a time-capsule retreat for travelers seeking a truly unspoiled Adriatic town. With an inviting Old Town, it seems custom-built for aimless strolling. Medieval architecture and numerous monuments of cultural heritage have made Kotor a UNESCO listed "World Natural and Historical Heritage Site". Through the entire city the buildings are criss-crossed with narrow streets and squares. One of these squares contains the Cathedral of Saint Tryphon (Sveti Tripun), a monument of Roman culture and one of the most recognisable symbols of the city.</p>
\$84.95 per person (will be collected with Princess Cruises final payment)	<p>Wednesday, July 11 - Day 7: SHORE EXCURSION PORT: Messina (Sicily) Italy</p> <p>QME 205: Taormina (approx. 4.5 hours)</p> <p>Your half-day adventure begins as you depart Messina for a scenic ride along Sicily's mountainous eastern coast on your way to the historic resort town of Taormina, perched 700 feet above the sea and overlooks the Bay of Naxos. Since motor vehicles are prohibited in the village, an elevator takes you from your motor coach to the city gates, where your walking tour begins. You have some free time to shop and explore this famed resort, its remnants of Greek and Roman history, its fine medieval quarter and castle ruins and many modern shops and restaurants. You also visit the inspiring Greek theater, built in the 3rd century BC and still used for concerts today. From here you can also see some spectacular views of Mt. Etna, Europe's famous and most active volcano. After an adventure filled with wonder, enjoy the scenic ride back along the coast to your cruise ship.</p>
\$139.95 per person (will be collected with Princess Cruises final payment)	<p>Thursday, July 12 - Day 8: SHORE EXCURSION PORT: Naples, Italy</p> <p>NAP 115 – SORRENTO & AMALFI COAST (approx. 9.5 hours)</p> <p>Your tour begins in Naples for a scenic drive to the stunning resort of Sorrento. After some free time to explore the village, you head to the Amalfi coast, Italy's most scenic stretch of coastline. The Amalfi Drive, a narrow road that threads above the sea with drop-dead views is a road trip to remember. We stop at the city of Amalfi and visit the awe-inspiring Amalfi Cathedral, home of the relics of St. Andrew. En route to Naples, we stop at a cameo factory where artisans apply skills handed down for generations, intricately carving seashell or coral into beautiful jewelry-true works of art and keepsake souvenirs. Your tour comes to its completion after an approximately 2 1/2-hour drive back to Naples where your ship is docked and awaiting your return. Please note: This excursion includes lunch in either Sorrento or Amalfi.</p>
